Tribal Chairman,
Morongo Band of
Mission Indians

Robert Martin is a tribal chairman of the Morongo Band of Mission Indians, a 1,000-member Indian tribe located near Banning, California. He has served for more than two decades in tribal government.

In addition to having served as a tribal council member and planning committee member, he was elected tribal council chairman at the age of 32. During his earlier tenure as chairman, he oversaw the construction of the original Casino Morongo.

He has worked closely with city, county, state and federal lawmakers on economic development; land, water and energy resources, education, environmental, transportation, regional impact and tribal gaming issues.

His advocacy for Native American education and advancement extends beyond his own tribe. He has served as a member of the board for the California Indian Manpower Consortium, the California Indian Child Welfare Consortium, Riverside/San Bernardino County Indian Health, Inc., and Southern California Tribal Chairmen's Association.
